EMERGENCY MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION AND REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED BRIEFING SCHEDULE AND HEARING

Plaintiffs through counsel hereby move on an emergency basis pursuant to Federal Rule Civil Procedure 65 for a preliminary injunction against Defendants preventing them from implementing or enforcing Subparagraphs 1904.35(b)(1)(i), (iii), and (iv) of OSHA's New Rule entitled "Improve Tracking of Workplace Injuries and Illnesses," 81 Fed. Reg. 29,624 (May 12, 2016). Absent injunctive relief, effective August 10, 2016, the challenged provisions of the New Rule will for the first time in the history of the OSH Act prohibit incident-based employer safety incentive programs and routine mandatory post-incident drug testing programs, notwithstanding substantial evidence in the administrative record that these programs are needed to make

workplaces safer. The New Rule is contrary to and exceeds OSHA's statutory authority and is

otherwise arbitrary, capricious and not in accordance with applicable law.

The standards for preliminary injunction are met in that Plaintiffs are likely to succeed on

the merits; Plaintiffs will suffer irreparable harm in the absence of an injunction preserving the

status quo; the balance of harms favors the Plaintiffs; and an injunction that preserves the status

quo of the past 45 years is in the public interest.

Reference is made to the Memorandum in support of this motion. An expedited briefing

schedule and hearing are requested. A proposed order is also attached.
